## HOW DO I CITE MY SOURCES?

### A BOOK

Author's Last Name, Initial.

(Publication Date).

Title of book.

Place of Publication:

Publisher.

### **EXAMPLE:**

Blyton, E. (2015). El Club de los Siete Secretos. Barcelona: RBA.





# MY BIBLIOGRAPHY



### **ENCYCLOPEDIA ONLINE**

Author's Last Name, Initials.

(IF NO AUTHOR JUST USE ARTICLE TITLE FIRST)

(Publication Date).

Title of article.

Title of encyclopedia.

Retrieved from database URL

#### **EXAMPLE:**

Respiratory system. (2018). In *Encyclopædia Britannica*. Retrieved from https://school.eb.co.uk/levels/intermediate/article/respiratory-system/276699

## WEBSITE

Creator/Author's Last Name, Initials.

(Publication or revision Date).

Title or description of page.

Retrieved from Name of Institution or Sponsoring Organization: URL
