A BOOK

Author's Last Name, Initial.

(Publication Date).

Title of book.

Place of Publication:

Publisher.

EXAMPLE:

Blyton, E. (2015). *El Club de los Siete Secretos*. Barcelona: RBA.

ENCYCLOPEDIA ONLINE

Author's Last Name, Initials.
(IF NO AUTHOR JUST USE ARTICLE TITLE FIRST)

(Publication Date).

Title of article.

Title of encyclopedia.

Retrieved from database URL

EXAMPLE:

Respiratory system. (2018). In *Encyclopædia Britannica*. Retrieved from <https://school.eb.co.uk/levels/intermediate/article/respiratory-system/276699>

WEBSITE

Creator/Author's Last Name, Initials.

(Publication or revision Date).

Title or description of page.

Retrieved from Name of Institution or Sponsoring Organization: URL

EXAMPLE:

Perritano, J. (2018, November 5). *Many Animals Eat Grass So Why Don't Humans?*
